Jojo Moyes is a British journalist and romance novelist since 2002. She is one of only a few authors to have twice won the Romantic Novel of the Year Award by the Romantic Novelists' Association and has been translated into eleven different languages.

After you is a sequel to the bestselling novel Me Before You. The video is her expansion of why she decided to write her first sequel and how she has developed her characters. She became a full-time novelist when her first book Sheltering Rain was published. She continues to write articles for The Daily Telegraph. She first won the award in 2004 for Foreign Fruit and in 2011 for The Last Letter From Your Lover.

His book **A Brief History of Seven Killings** has been described by the New York Times as "a Tarantino remake of *The Harder They Come*, but with a soundtrack by Bob Marley and a script by Oliver Stone and William Faulkner...epic in every sense of that word: sweeping, mythic, over-the-top, colossal and dizzyingly complex." 9. THE GIRL ON THE TRAIN, by Paula Hawkins. (Riverhead.) A psychological thriller set in the environs of London is full of complications and betrayals.

10. DOWN THE RABBIT HOLE, by J. D. Robb and others. (Jove.) Five tales, including an Eve Dallas novella, inspired by "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland."
